## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Require the Department of Human Services to Set Child Welfare Fee-for-service Rates Based on Yearly Negotiations with Private Nonprofit Community Residential Treatment Providers.



1	Be it enacted by the reopie of the State of Maine as follows:
3	22 MRSA §4062-A is enacted to read:
5	§4062-A. Residential treatment service rate setting
7	1. Rate negotiation procedure. The Division of Child and Family Services shall establish, in conjunction with nonprofit
9	community residential treatment service providers, a rate-setting procedure that reflects the providers' actual costs of the
11	clothing, board and care of children. The Division of Child and Family Services shall not establish the procedure without the
13	input and involvement of an organization that represents nonprofit community residential treatment service providers.
<b>1</b> 5	2. Rate basis. Rates set pursuant to the procedure
17	established in subsection 1 must reflect the providers' actual costs of the clothing, board and care of children based on an
19	annual occupancy rate of 85%.
21	3. Effective dates. The rate-setting procedure required by subsection 1 must be established by January 1, 1990. The rates
23	established by that procedure must be effective no later than July 1, 1990.

27	STATEMENT OF FACT
29	This bill requires the Department of Human Services, Division of Child and Family Services to establish, in
31	conjunction with nonprofit community residential treatment service providers, rate-setting procedures to reflect the actual
33	costs of clothing, board and care of children referred to providers by the department, based on an annual occupancy rate of
35	85%. The procedure must be established by January 1, 1990 and the new rates must be effective by July 1, 1990.
