STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

Resolve, to Establish a Blue Ribbon Task Force to Promote Equity of Opportunity for Women in the Public School System.

(EMERGENCY)

 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless
enacted as emergencies; and

5 Whereas, recent studies and statistics show a critical concern regarding the supply and demand of Maine's school 7 superintendents and principals; and

9 Whereas, there are a significant number of women holding principals' certificates and a correspondingly low number of 11 women holding principal or superintendent positions; and

13 Whereas, if students are to have high aspirations and to be unfettered by stereotypes, appropriate role models are necessary;
15 and

17 Whereas, education has a special responsibility to ensure equity of opportunity; and

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Whereas, focused public discussion of this problem is long 21 overdue; and

23 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 25 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 27 safety; now, therefore, be it

Task force established; membership. Resolved: 29 That there is created a Blue Ribbon Task Force to Promote Equity of Opportunity 31 for Women in the Public School System. The task force shall consist of 19 members to include representation of 2 Senators 33 appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House; 35 one Legislator to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House who shall serve as the task 37 force chair; 2 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Education to be appointed by the chairs of that committee; 2 39 members to be appointed by the Governor; one representative of the Maine School Superintendents Association to be appointed by 41 that association; one representative of the Maine School Boards Association to be appointed by that association; one representative of the Maine Teachers Association to be appointed 43 by that association; one representative of the Maine Federation 45 of Teachers to be appointed by that federation; one representative of theMaine Secondary School Principals' 47 Association appointed by that association; to be one representative of the Maine Elementary Principals' Association to be appointed by that association; one member of the Maine Human 49 Rights Commission to be appointed by the chair of that 51 commission; one representative of the Department of Educational andCultural Services to be appointed

 by the commissioner of that department; one representative of the Maine Commission for Women to be appointed by the chair of that
commission; and one representative of the Maine Women's Lobby to be appointed by that organization; and be it further

Staff; compensation; study. Resolved: That the task force shall 7 study the representation and underrepresentation of women in the public education system, review practices and the cause of those practices that present barriers to women achieving administrative 9 positions and recommend measures calculated to correct any inequities found. The task force may conduct hearings, develop 11 surveys or utilize any other forum to gather data and make 13 recommendations. Task force members shall receive legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, 15 section 2, for days in attendance at commission meetings. A11 members shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon application 17 to the Legislative Committee; and be it further

19 Convening of task force. Resolved: That, when the appointment of all task force members is completed, the cochair shall call 21 the task force together for its first meeting no later than 30 days after the effective date of this resolve. The task force 23 shall meet at least 6 times, and more frequently if necessary, to respond to the duties of this task force; and be it further

**Report. Resolved:** That a report outlining the findings and 27 recommendations of the task force shall be submitted to the Governor and to the Joint Standing Committee on Education no 29 later than March 15, 1990; and be it further

31 Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

1 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 3 preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved. 5 7 STATEMENT OF FACT 9 Women make up over 65% of the teachers in Maine. One out of every 4 persons holding principals' certificates is female, yet women are vastly underrepresented in principals' positions and 11 other administrative positions in the public education system. Public discussion is relevant. A blue ribbon task force is 13 needed to hold hearings, take relevant testimony and deliberate 15 the facts before making meaningful recommendations. This resolve establishes such a task force with the requirement of reporting 17 for the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature. Appropriations are included which will cover per diems and 19 expenses and enable the task force to hire project staff.
