An Act to Allow Notaries Public to Aid Absentee Voters Without a Separate Witness.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 1 Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §754-A, sub-§3, ¶B, as amended by PL 1987, 3 c. 736,  $\S42$ , is further amended to read: 5 Β. The voter or the aide must mark the ballot in the 7 presence of one of the following witnesses: Notary public, clerk of a municipality, clerk of courts or another g individual. If the voter is assisted by a notary public, no witness is required. 11 Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §754-A, sub-§3, ¶¶C and E, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 357, §§12 and 19, are amended to read: 13 15 The voter or the aide, before marking the ballot, must C. show it to the witness who must examine it to be certain it 17 is unmarked. If the voter is assisted by a notary public, the notary must examine the ballot to be certain it is 19 unmarked. 21 Е. The voter or the aide must mark the ballot according to section 691 or 692 so that it is impossible for anyone else 23 present to see how the voter voted, then seal the ballot in its return envelope. A notary public assisting a voter may either witness the voter's signature or, if requested by the voter, 29 complete and sign the affidavit and the witness The aide must complete certification. and sign the 31 certification for aides on the outside of the envelope. 33 35 STATEMENT OF FACT 37 This bill provides that when an absentee voter is assisted by a notary public, no additional witness is required.
