Resolve, to Create the Commission to Study the Feasibility of a Southern Maine Regional Jetport.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

1 Study commission created. Resolved: That there is created the Commission to Study the Feasibility of a Southern Maine Regional Jetport; and be it further

Appointment. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 9 members as follows: one Senator, whose district includes 7 communities in southern Maine, appointed by the President of the Senate; 2 Representatives, whose districts each include 9 communities in southern Maine, appointed by the Speaker of the House; the Commissioner of Transportation or the commissioner's designee; the Commissioner of Environmental Protection or the 11 commissioner's designee; the Director of the State Development Office or the director's designee; the Director of the State 13 Planning Office or the director's designee; and 2 members representing the public, appointed by the Governor, each of whom 15 resides in a southern Maine community. The commission shall 17 choose a chair from among its members; and be it further

Duties. Resolved: 19 That the commission shall undertake to study and write a comprehensive plan concerning the air 21 transportation needs of southern Maine. The commission shall examine current and future air traffic demands on the Portland 23 International Jetport and shall specifically focus on the feasibility of establishing a regional jetport in southern Maine; 25 and be it further

Compensation. Resolved: 27 That legislative members shall receive per diem compensation and all other members shall be reimbursed for travel and other necessary expenses; and be it 29 further

Report. Resolved: That the commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation, to the 33 Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature.
