IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Concerning Trailer Dealer Licensing.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §341, sub-§5-A is enacted to read:
5	<u>5-A. Light camp trailer. "Light camp trailer" means a camp</u>
7	<u>trailer, as defined in section 1, designed for a gross weight of 10,000 pounds or less.</u>

9	Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §341, sub-§10-B is enacted to read:
11	10-B. Utility trailer. "Utility trailer" means a trailer
13	<u>or semitrailer, used for general purposes, designed for a gross</u> weight of 10,000 pounds or less.
15	Sec. 3. 29 MRSA 358, as amended by PL 1985, c. 401, 13, is further amended to read:

19	§358. Utility, light camp, boat or snowmobile trailer dealers; fee
21	Every manufacturer or dealer in <u>utility, light camp</u> , boat or snowmobile trailers shall annually pay a fee of \$50 for a
23	registration certificate to handle, demonstrate, sell and
25	exchange <u>utility, light camp,</u> boat or snowmobile trailers. Upon payment of \$5 per plate, <u>dealer</u> plates shall be issued, the
	number to be determined by the Secretary of State, who is
27	authorized to prescribe limitations of use of such <u>the</u> plates. Extra registration plates shall be furnished to replace lost or
29	mutilated plates for \$5 each.
31	Sec. 4. 29 MRSA §359, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 529, §1, is amended to read:
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35	§359. Trailer and mobile home dealer
	Trailer registration plates and lieense licenses shall be
37	issued to those persons, who qualify under this subchapter, <u>and</u> whose primary business is the selling of new and used trailers or
39	mobile homes. <u>This section does not apply to dealers who handle</u> only utility, light camp, boat or snowmobile trailers pursuant to

45	STATEMENT OF FACT
47	This bill includes utility and light camp trailers in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29, section 358 which requires
49	registration of boat and snowmobile trailer dealers in order to clarify that a single dealer need not have more than one
51	registration to trade in all these types of trailers.
