STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Increase the Penalties for Repeat Violations of the Prostitution Laws.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

17-A MRSA §856 is enacted to read:

§856. Penalty enhancement

Promotion of prostitution, engaging in prostitution, engaging a prostitute or patronizing prostitution of a minor is a Class C crime if the actor has 2 or more prior Maine convictions for any combination of violations of section 852, 853, 853-A, 853-B or 855. For purposes of this section, the dates of the 2 or more prior convictions must precede the offense being enhanced by no more than 10 years, although the prior convictions may have occurred on the same day. This section does not apply if the 2 or more offenses occurred within a 3-day period. The date of conviction shall be deemed the date that sentence is imposed, even though an appeal was taken. The dates of prior offenses shall be presumed to be that stated in the complaint, information or indictment, notwithstanding the use of the words "on or about" or their equivalent.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill adds a penalty enhancement section to the prostitution chapter of the Criminal Code. It increases the sentencing class for violations of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, section 853, 853-A, 853-B or 855 to a Class C if the actor has 2 prior Maine convictions for prostitution-related offenses. This change will aid in identifying, prosecuting, and sentencing repeat offenders.
