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#### §13522. Allocation of salary grants

The commissioner shall allocate the money appropriated by the Legislature for career teacher salary grants in accordance with the following conditions.

1. Payment to school administrative units. Beginning in fiscal year 1989-90 and annually thereafter, each school administrative unit and private school approved for tuition purposes shall receive a grant equal to \$750 multiplied by the number of teachers employed by that unit or school as determined under subsection 2.

2. Calculation of grants. The number of teachers to be used in computing the career teacher salary grant payments under subsection I shall be the number of full-time equivalent teachers whose local employment responsibility includes an assignment to work directly with students in an instructional or counseling relationship on a regular basis, excluding teachers whose salaries are paid fully from federal funds. The number of teachers to be used in computing career teacher salary grant payments in any year shall be based on the local staff information data supplied by the school administrative unit or private school approved for tuition purposes to the department in October of the preceding year and adjusted in December of the current year by the October data for that year.

3. Payment of grants. The commissioner shall make career teacher salary grant payments to school administrative units and private schools approved for tuition purposes as part of the monthly subsidy payment.

#### §13523. Local collective bargaining

1. Use of salary grants. Career teacher salary grants shall supplement and not supplant funds available from school administrative units and private schools approved for tuition purposes and shall not be considered as offsets to the unit during local collective bargaining for the purpose of setting teacher salaries.

2. Career teacher salary grants. When a teacher bargaining agent exists, the teacher bargaining agent and school administrative unit or private school approved for tuition purposes shall, at a minimum, in accordance with the collective bargaining procedures set forth in Title 26, chapter 9-A, negotiate or, when a contract is in effect, reopen negotiations, as to the use of the career teacher salary grants provided in this chapter for teacher salary schedules. When negotiations are reopened, each party may introduce one other issue into the negotiations as long as the career teacher salary grants are

If an agreement as to the use of the career teacher salary grants and any other issue has been reached by the school administrative unit and bargaining 3 agent, a certificate of agreement shall be signed by both parties 5 before funds are disbursed by the State. When no bargaining agent exists, school administrative units shall consult with 7 teachers as to the use of the career teacher salary grant for teacher salaries. 9 §13524. - 2. Development of grant proposals. Proposals for use of grant funds under this section shall be developed by a local planning committee. The development of a grant proposal shall be a collaborative effort including teachers, support personnel, administrators, parents and school board members, with a majority of the committee consisting of teachers. Proposals developed by the committee shall be presented as recommendations to the superintendent and the school board for action. The school board shall make the final decision on whether a grant application is

submitted and on the content of the proposal.

1 3. Grant application. School administrative units applying for grants under this section shall submit their application to 3 the commissioner by March 1st of each year. The commissioner 5 shall notify units of the decision for grant award or denial by July 1st of each year. The grant allocation, as determined in subsection 4, shall be distributed to a school administrative 7 unit by the commissioner by September 1st of each year. 9 4. Allocation of grants. The State shall provide each school administrative unit with a minimum of \$2,000 or \$20 per 11 pupil, whichever is greater, based on the previous October's enrollment. The grants shall be made annually commencing on July 13 1, 1990, and shall terminate after 3 years unless continued by act of the Legislature. 15 17 A. The department shall develop a process for evaluating enhanced quality of time grants. Beginning in July 1992, the department shall use that evaluation process to assess 19 the effectiveness of the grants awarded in fiscal year 1990-91 and fiscal year 1991-92 in improving instructional 21 quality in schools. The department shall present the results 23 of the evaluation to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters by January 1, 1993. The report shall include, at a minimum, 25 the recommendation of the department on whether the grants program should be continued and, if continued, how it should 27 be financed, including whether the grants should be incorporated into the formula or held outside the formula 29 forever. During the evaluation process, the department shall develop a manual of effective practices and working 31 models to assist schools in improving the use of instructional time. Following consideration of the 33 department's recommendations, the committee may introduce 35 legislation for consideration by the First Regular Session of the 116th Legislature. 37 5. Utilization of grants negotiable. The utilization of the enhanced quality of time grants shall be a negotiable item to 39 the extent that there is an impact upon working conditions, hours 41 or salaries as set forth in Title 26, chapter 9-A, and, when a contract is in effect, shall be cause for reopening negotiations 43 as to the use of these funds.

6. Rule-making authority. The commissioner shall establish rules to carry out this section.

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Sec. 6. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

21	This bill appropriates \$11,857,169 and \$13,573,506 from the
23	General Fund in fiscal years 1989-90 and 1990-91, respectively. One million dollars of these General Fund appropriations in
25	fiscal year 1990-91 will be transferred to a nonlapsing, revolving fund account. This transfer is an increase in
27	dedicated revenue, therefore, these funds are also allocated in this bill.'
29	
31	STATEMENT OF FACT
33	This amendment retains the 3 original purposes of the bill. It provides supplemental grants to teachers pursuing continued
35	study or advanced degrees, provides grants to school units based on the number of teachers employed to be used to enhance teacher
37	salaries and provides grants to school units to be used to improve the instructional quality of the school day by, for
39	example, providing more teacher planning time and reassigning nonteaching duties. The salary grants begin in fiscal year
41	1989-90 and the continuing study grants and the quality of instruction grants begin in fiscal year 1990-91.
43	
45	In addition to several technical changes the amendment accomplishes the following:
47	1. Clarifies that continuing study grants are available to
49	secondary vocational education teachers pursuing a bachelors degree;
51	2. Extends the continuing study grants to school

administrators at the same rate as for teachers;
