IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Concerning the Construction of Portable Classrooms.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

47	STATEMENT OF FACT
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51	Under the current law, part of the state subsidy which school administrative units receive is based on the funds they expend to lease portable, temporary classrooms. The subsidy does

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1 not cover funds used for the purchase or construction of portable classrooms.

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The purpose of this bill is to include rent-to-own lease payments in the state subsidy calculations beginning January 1, 1988. The State currently makes payments of over \$1,360,000 a year for the lease of temporary classroom space, and yet has nothing tangible to show for the expenditures. This bill also includes purchases of portable, temporary classroom space in the subsidy calculations.

addition, this bill requires Commissioner the of In 13 Educational and Cultural Services to develop guidelines for schools to set up programs for students of high schools and post-secondary schools, such as vocational-technical institutes, 15 to build portable classrooms for the school administrative units 17 as part of the school curriculum. Once a classroom is built, the school administrative unit may use it, or may sell it or lease 19 it, for any purposes.
