An Act To Make Benefits Under the Household Tax and Rent Refund Program More Accessible.

(EMERGENCY)

	This bill makes the public more aware and better able to
	take advantage of assistance available under the household tax
	and rent refund program.
	Section 1 of the bill clarifies the method for calculating
	the benefit base for claimants such as mobile home owners who
	must rent a lot on which to locate their home, who pay both rent
	and property tax for their homestead.
	Section 2 requires that the program application form and
	instructions be written and designed to accommodate a person with
	a 6th grade reading level. Reading difficulties are a serious problem for at least 10% of the State's population. Forty-five
	problem for at least 10% of the State's population. Forty-five thousand Maine residents did not finish the 8th grade and 11,000
	did not finish the 5th.
