IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Better Incorporate Vocational Education into High School Graduation Requirements.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

20-A MRSA §4722, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. C, §§5 and 7, is amended to read:

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3. Satisfactory completion. A diploma shall be awarded only to secondary school students who have satisfactorily completed all diploma requirements in accordance with the academic standards of the school administrative unit. Vocational students may, with the approval of the commissioner, satisfy the 2nd-year math and science and , the 3rd-year 2nd-year social studies and the fine arts requirements of subsection 2 through separate or integrated study within the vocational school curriculumn.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill adds to the list of high school graduation 19 requirements a student may satisfy through the vocational school curriculum. Under the bill, a student, with the approval of the 21 Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services, may satisfy 23 the fine arts requirement through separate or integrated study within the vocational school curriculum. The bill recognizes 25 that vocational students, in the course of the vocational curriculum, are exposed to and learn artistic as well as mathematical, scientific and social science concepts, although 27 these concepts may not be presented in a conventional academic 29 manner.

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The bill also corrects the reference to the 2nd-year social studies requirement for high school graduation.
