IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Recover Windfall Profits from Bottle Deposits.

(AFTER DEADLINE)



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §1866, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

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6. Distributors reports and payments. Each distributor shall, prior to February 1st of each year, report to the 7 commissioner the total amount of deposits paid to it by any person during the preceding calendar year, as well as the total amount of refunds paid by it to any person during that calendar q year. Prior to February 1st of each calendar year, each 11 distributor shall also pay to the commissioner, for deposit in the General Fund, the difference between the total amount of 13 deposits paid to it in the preceding calendar year and the total amount of refunds paid by it during that year.

Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §1869, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

3. False reports. Any individual person who knowingly makes any false report pursuant to section 1866, subsection 6, is quilty of a Class E crime.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under the Maine returnable beverage container law, a person 27 purchasing from a distributor a beverage subject to the law is required to pay a deposit to the distributor in an amount fixed 29 by the distributor. The distributor is then required to refund the deposit to anyone returning the used beverage container to that distributor. Many times a container on which a distributor 31 has received a deposit is never returned. In such a case, the distributor simply keeps the deposit as a windfall. 33 These windfalls are estimated to aggregate as much as \$4,000,000 to 35 \$5,000,000 annually.
