The number of Representatives shall be divided into the number of inhabitants of the State 3 exclusive of foreigners not naturalized according to the latest Federal Decennial Census or a State Census previously ordered by the Legislature to coincide with the Federal Decennial Census, to 7 determine a mean population figure for each Representative District. Each Representative District shall be formed of contiquous and compact territory and shall cross political subdivision lines the least number of times necessary to establish as nearly as practicable equally populated districts. 11 Whenever the population of a municipality entitles it to more 13 than one district, all whole districts shall be drawn within the Any population remainder within municipal boundaries. 15 municipality shall be included in a district with contiguous territory and shall be kept intact. 17

Constitution, Art. IV, Part Second, §1 is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

Section 1. Number of Senators. The Senate shall consist of an odd number of Senators, not less than 31 nor more than 35, elected at the same time as Representatives by the qualified electors of the districts into which the State shall be from time to time divided. The term of office for Senators shall be for 2 years, except as provided in this section. Beginning with the general elections to be held in 1994, Senators in the even-numbered districts shall be elected to 4-year terms. In 1996, Senators in the odd-numbered districts shall be elected to 4-year terms.

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendments proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following questions:

Question A: "Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to establish 4-year terms of office for Representatives in even-numbered districts beginning in 1994, and 4-year terms of office for Representatives in odd-numbered districts beginning in 1996?"

Question B: "Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to establish 4-year terms of office for Senators in even-numbered districts beginning in 1994, and 4-year terms of office for Senators in odd-numbered districts beginning in 1996?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on these questions, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal voters are in favor of Question A, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in favor of Question B, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation.

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment provides that the issue of extending the terms of Legislators to 4 years shall be presented to the voters as 2 questions. The amendment also provides for staggered terms, with members from even-numbered districts elected to 4-year terms in 1994 and members from odd-numbered districts elected to 4-year terms in 1996.
