An Act to Create a Hazardous Highway Spills Fund.



3	37-B MRSA §707 is enacted to read:
5	§707. Nonlapsing revolving fund
7	1. Creation. A nonlapsing, interest-earning revolving
9	fund, known as the Hazardous Highway Spills Fund, is created to implement the purposes of this section. Any unexpended balance of funds may be carried over for continued use on the program.
11	The revolving fund may receive, invest and expend funds from gifts, grants, bequests and donations in addition to funds
13	appropriated by the State.
15	2. Assistance to municipalities. The Maine Emergency Management Agency shall make grants available to municipalities
17	that apply for funds to clean up spills of hazardous materials on highways and other public ways. The Maine Emergency Management
19	Agency shall promulgate rules in accordance with the Maine Adminstrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375 to provide
21	eligibility guidelines and administer the fund.
23	3. Fund offset. The Maine Emergency Management Agency is authorized to offset funds expended under subsection 2 by
25	charging the person or entity responsible for transporting the materials requiring cleanup for the cost of the clean up.
27	4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated
