13	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 419, L.D. 1130, Bill, "An Act Dealing with Removal of Dislodged Lobster Gear"
15	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
17	clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:
19	'12 MRSA §6434, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is
21	repealed and the following enacted in its place:
23	§6434. Molesting lobster gear
25	No person may raise, lift, transfer, possess or in any manner molest any lobster trap, warp, buoy or car except as
27	provided in this section.
29	1. Permitted activities. Lobster traps, warps, buoys and cars may be raised, lifted, transferred, possessed or otherwise
31	molested by the following:
33	A. A marine patrol officer;
35	B. The licensed owner;
37	C, Any person having written permission from the licensed owner; and
39	D. Any person authorized by rule pursuant to subsection 2.
41	
43	2. Promulgation of rules required. The commissioner shall promulgate rules, no later than January 1, 1990, authorizing the removal of traps, warps, buoys or cars that are washed up above
45	the mean low tide mark or are otherwise abandoned or lost.
47	3. Prohibition. Traps, warps, buoys or cars may not be used for fishing by any person other than the licensed owner.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 419, L.D. 1130

FISCAL NOTE

It is anticipated that all costs associated with this legislation would be absorbed by the Department of Marine Resources utilizing existing resources.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

11 This amendment changes the original bill to require the Commissioner of Marine Resources to promulgate rules to allow the 13 removal of abandoned lobster gear. It also prohibits anyone other than the licensed owner from fishing with that gear. The 15 amendment also adds a fiscal note.
