An Act to Prohibit Injurious Hazing of Public School Students.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:	
3	20-A MRSA §6553 is enacted to read:	
5	<u>§6553. Prohibition of hazing</u>	
7	<b>1. Definitions.</b> As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the	
9	following meanings.	
L 1. L 3	A. "Injurious hazing" means any action or situation which recklessly or intentionally endangers the mental or physical health of a student enrolled in a public school.	
L5 L7	<u>B. "Violator" means any person or any organization which engages in injurious hazing.</u>	
19	2. Adoption of policy. The school board shall adopt a policy which establishes that "injurious hazing," either on or	
21	<u>off school property, by any student, staff member, group or affiliated with the public school is prohibited.</u>	
23	<u>3. Penalties. The school board shall establish penalties</u> for violation of the rules established in subsection 2. The	
25	penalties shall include, but not be limited to, provisions for:	
27	A. In the case of a person not associated with the public school, the ejection of the violator from school property;	
29	<u>B. In the case of a student, administrator or staff</u>	
1	violator, the individual's suspension, expulsion or other appropriate disciplinary action; and	
3	appropriate disciplinary action; and	
5	<u>C. In the case of an organization affiliated with the public school which authorizes hazing, rescission of</u>	
	permission for that organization to operate on school	
, )	<u>property or receive any other benefit of affiliation with</u> <u>the public school.</u>	
	<u>These penalties shall be in addition to any other civil or criminal penalty to which the violator or organization may be subject.</u>	
3	4. Administrative responsibility. The school board shall	
ı.	assign responsibility for administering the policy to the	
	<u>superintendent of schools and establish procedures for appealing</u> the action or lack of action of the superintendent.	
9	5. Dissemination. The school board shall clearly set forth	
	the policy and penalties adopted and shall distribute copies of	
1	them to all students enrolled in the public school.	

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits injurious hazing in public schools and is similar to the prohibition contained in the Maine Revised
Statutes, Title 20-A, section 10004, which applies to post-secondary schools. School boards are required to adopt
policies and penalties to deter hazing.
