STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the Lottery Laws.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 8 MRSA 376, sub-1, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 505, 2, is amended to read:

The commission may suspend or revoke, after notice and 1. 7 hearing in-a-manner-consistent-with-the-Maine-Administrative Procedure-Act,-Title-5,-chapter-375, any license issued pursuant 9 to this chapter. Any suspension or revocation is a final agency action for the purposes of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter VII. The license may be 11 temporarily suspended by the commission without prior notice, 13 pending any prosecution, investigation or hearing. A license may be suspended or revoked by the commission for just cause, 15 including one or more of the following reasons:

- 17 A. Failure to account for tickets received or the proceeds of the sale of tickets or to file a bond, if required by the commission, or to comply with instructions of the commission concerning the licensed activity;
 - B. Conviction of any criminal offense;
- C. Failure to file any return or report, to keep records or to pay any tax;
- 27. D. Engaging in fraud, deceit, misrepresentation or conduct prejudicial to public confidence;
- E. Insufficiency of the number of tickets sold by the sales agent; or
- F. A material change, since issuance of the license, with
 respect to any of the matters required to be considered by
 the director under section 375.
- 37 Sec. 2. 8 MRSA §389 is enacted to read:
- 39 **§389.** Disputes concerning tickets

In the event a dispute arises as to whether a ticket is a winning ticket, the player's sole remedy shall be to apply to the
commission for a refund of the price allegedly wagered. The commission's decision on whether the ticket is a winning ticket
or whether to refund the price allegedly wagered is a final agency action for the purposes of the Maine Administrative
Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter VII.

STATEMENT OF FACT

5 This bill clarifies that the State Lottery Commission may suspend and revoke licenses after notice and a hearing and that
7 any suspension or revocation is a final agency action under the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Maine Revised Statutes, Title
9 5, chapter 375, subchapter VII.

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11 The bill also sets an aggrieved player's sole remedy as a refund of the price of the ticket. It also makes the 13 commission's decision on whether the ticket was winning ticket or whether a refund should be paid a final agency action.
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The commission's decisions will be reviewable by the 17 Superior Court under an arbitrary or capricious action standard.
