STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Provide for the Forfeiture of Firearms Used to Commit Crimes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

17-A MRSA §1158 is enacted to read:

5 <u>§1158. Forfeiture of firearms</u>

As part of every judgment of conviction and sentence imposed, every firearm used by, or in the possession or under the control of, the defendant or any accomplice during the commission of any offense shall be forfeited to the State and the court shall so order, unless another person can satisfy the court prior to the judgment and by a preponderance of the evidence that such other person had a right to possess the firearm, to the exclusion of the defendant, at the time of the offense.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

Like many other forfeiture laws, under this bill the State 21 takes possession and ownership of firearms used in the commission of a crime unless someone not involved in the offense can 23 demonstrate a right to that weapon. This exception protects someone from whom the firearm was stolen. Unlike many of the 25 other forfeiture provisions, forfeiture under this bill depends upon actual conviction, so the State's burden of persuasion on 27 some issues is much higher than in the normal civil forfeiture provision. Unlike cars, boats, airplanes and houses, firearms 29 are usually not registered nor is there some certificate of title or central repository of ownership information, so it is 31 difficult to require the same sort of formal notice provided for other property subject to forfeiture. The serial numbers of 33 law stolen firearms are, however, generally available to enforcement agencies. 35
