An Act to Allow the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages in Bowling Centers.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 28-A MRSA §2, sub-§15, ¶B-1 is enacted to read:
5	B-1. "Bowling center" means an indoor facility operating at
7	<u>least 8 regulation lanes for the purpose of conducting the</u> game of bowling which is open to the general public and
9	<u>which has suitable facilities for the sale and consumption</u> of liquor.

33	1. Issuance of licenses. The commission may issue licenses under this section for the sale of spirits, wine and malt liquor
35	to be consumed on the premises to <u>bowling centers,</u> golf clubs, indoor ice skating clubs and indoor racquet clubs and- <del>indoor-ice</del>
37	skating-clubs as defined in section 2, subsection 15, paragraphs <u>B-1</u> , G, J and K respectively.
39	2. Food availability. The licensee shall offer food for
41	sale to the public at all times that liquor is for sale.
43	<b>3.</b> Separate area for sale of food and liquor. The licensee shall set aside a separate area for the sale of food and liquor
45	in accordance with the rules of the commission.
47	STATEMENT OF FACT
49	This bill allows bowling centers to become licensed to sell
51	spirits, wine and malt liquor to be consumed on the premises.
