IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

**RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of** Maine to Require the State to Pay Property Taxes on State-owned Property. **Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED:** Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

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Constitution, Art. IX, §8, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

5. The State shall pay property tax to a municipality on the full assessed value of all state-owned property located in that municipality.

**Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved:** That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to require that the State pay property taxes to municipalities on all state-owned property?"

25 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice 27 by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation 29 meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same 31 manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal voters are in favor of the amendment, the Governor 33 shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation. 35

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This constitutional resolution requires that the State pay 47 property taxes to municipalities on all state-owned property within those municipalities.

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
