3 12 MRSA §6434, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is amended to read:

§6434. Molesting gear

It shall be unlawful for any person, except a coastal warden, marine patrol officer, the United States Coast Guard, ferry boats, the licensed owner or a person having written permission from the licensed owner, to raise, lift, transfer, possess or in any manner molest any lobster trap, warp, buoy or car. It shall be unlawful for any person to install, repair or operate an automatic line-cutting device on the propeller shaft of any vessel.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the use of automatic line-cutting devices, commonly referred to as spurs, in Maine waters.
