STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Maintain Legal Services for Low-income Citizens.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 1 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 3 as emergencies; and

Whereas. federal funding through the Legal Services Corporation to Pine Tree Legal Assistance was cut by 28% in 1982; and

Whereas, federal funding over the 7 years since that time has not returned to 1981 levels and has not kept pace with costs; and

Whereas, state appropriations to Pine Tree Legal Assistance 13 have not increased since 1985 yet provide a vital 10% of the 15 program's budget; and

Whereas, over 18% of the State's population is eligible to receive free civil legal services from the 6 area offices of Pine Tree Legal Assistance; and

21 Whereas, without the additional funds provided in this Act Pine Tree Legal Assistance would be unable to continue to provide its current level of services; and 23

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 25 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 31

Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases the state appropriation to Pine Tree Legal Assistance to make up a small part of the loss of federal funds since 1982, and to enable the program to continue the current level of civil legal services to eligible low-income individuals through 6 local offices.
