STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

Resolve, to Assess the Needs of the Equine Industry and to Establish a Commission to Study the Creation of a Statewide Horse Council.



Needs assessment. Resolved: That the University of Maine System, Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics, shall conduct a needs assessment of the horse-related industries in the State; and be it further

Results. Resolved: That the results of the needs assessment shall be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over agriculture matters no later than December 1, 1989; and be it further

Commission established. Resolved: That there is established the Commission to Study the Creation of a State Horse Council; and be it further

Membership. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of 9 members as follows: Three members shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, including 2 Senators and one member of the general public who has an interest in horses or horse-related industries; 3 members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, including 2 members of the House of Representatives and one member of the general public who has an interest in horses or horse-related industries; and 3 members of the general public, to be appointed by the Governor, who have interests in horses or horse-related industries; and be it further

Study. Resolved: That the commission prepare a plan for the creation of a statewide horse council. In developing this plan, the commission shall consider the common interests of the State's equine industries, the means of communication within the industries, and the importance of monitoring legislation and administrative decisions that have an impact on those industries and on horse-related activities. The commission shall invite concerned members of the public to present testimony concerning these matters; and be it further

Convening the commission. Resolved: That all appointments will be made within 30 days of the effective date of this resolve. The Governor shall call the first meeting of the commission. At the first meeting, the members shall elect a chair and other officers; and be it further

Staff; compensation. Resolved: That the commission shall request necessary staff assistance from the Legislative Council. The members of the commission who are Legislators shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days in attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon application to the Legislative Council; and be it further

Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to
