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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill establishes a committee to develop a comprehensive mental health plan for children who are deaf. The need for such a plan was identified in the report and recommendations of a children's services subcommittee of the Maine Advisory Council on Deafness in 1986. The resulting plan will facilitate the development of community-based services for deaf children.

This bill also provides funds for mental health services for deaf persons. Currently, case management services are available to deaf persons in southern Maine. This bill appropriates funds to assure equal accessibility of mental health services to persons with deafness in all parts of the State.

Finally, this bill also provides funds to expand the availability of interpreter services and telecommunications equipment from private mental health practitioners.
