HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 882, L.D. 1226

Provides funds to cover the initial costs of the state mandate that all public schools with greater than 40% needy children must participate in the National School Breakfast Program.

## FISCAL NOTE

This bill requires that all public schools, with greater than 40% needy children, must participate in the National School Breakfast Program for kindergarten and part-day students. It also requires schools that participate to charge fees that are permissible under federal law for reduced-price and full-price breakfasts. The money collected must be used to offset the costs of providing the breakfasts. As a result of the state mandate law, the State is required to pay 100% of the additional costs incurred during the first 2 years of the mandate. After the first 2 years, these additional costs will be paid through the school subsidy formula. The maximum future additional appropriations required are \$9,768 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$5,550 in fiscal year 1992-93 and thereafter.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment requires schools to charge fees that are permitted under current law for reduced-price and full-price breakfasts and to use those fees to offset the costs of providing the breakfasts. The amendment also replaces the appropriation and fiscal note.
