An Act to Amend the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §8051, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 551, §3, is amended to read:

7	§8051. Adoption of rules of practice
9	In addition to other rule-making requirements imposed by statute <u>law</u> , each agency shall adopt rules of practice governing the conduct of adjudicatory proceedings, licensing proceedings
11	and the rendering of advisory rulings, except to the extent that such rules are provided by statute law. Any agency rule of
13	practice which imposes a time period or deadline for the filing of any submission or for the service of any paper on an agency or
15	on any other party shall provide that service is complete either:
17	1. Mailing. Upon mailing; or
1.9	2. Delivery. Upon delivery to an agency, a party or a party's attorney either by in-hand delivery to the recipient or
21	by delivery to the recipient's office.

25	3. Filing and service. The filing of any submission in any adjudicatory proceeding or the service of any paper on a party to

37	STATEMENT OF FACT
39	This bill clarifies when a filing of a submission or service of a document is complete for rule-making and adjudicatory
41	proceedings conducted under the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375. Service and filings will be complete
43	either upon mailing or upon delivery to a party, or to a party's

office. These provisions are modeled after those contained in

the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure.

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
