STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Establish Requirements for Monitoring the State's Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 38 MRSA §425-A is enacted to read:

5 <u>§425-A. Water monitoring</u>

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In order to monitor the waters of the State, the department shall conduct, in addition to routine daytime monitoring, weekend
and night monitoring and unscheduled and unannounced inspections to ensure compliance with effluent limitations and other license
and legal requirements affecting the State's waters. Waters and facilities to be monitored may be selected randomly or on the basis of previous or likely violations of licensed discharge limitations or other state water quality laws.

Where the department identifies violations of water quality17laws or waste discharge license limits that pose a significant
and immediate risk to public health, the commissioner shall19notify the Department of Human Services and local health
officials of those conditions.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill is to ensure that Maine's rivers have improved water quality in the future by providing monitoring and inspection during nightime, weekends and unannounced periods. According to the Department of Environmental Protection, the monitoring and inspection program envisioned here will be limited to no more than an additional 5% of the department's annual water quality monitoring and inspection services.
