### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the Law Governing the State Capitol Commission.

(EMERGENCY) (After Deadline) **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the State Capitol Commission is entrusted with the task of developing a plan for the preservation and development of the aesthetic and historical integrity of the State Capitol and its adjacent grounds; and

Whereas, preservation of the Capitol Park area is an 11 integral and necessary component of successfully completing this task; and

Whereas, development of the plan requires the active 15 participation and attention of the Director of the State Capitol Commission; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
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Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §901, first  $\P$ , as enacted by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. EE, §1, is amended to read:

29 The State Capitol Commission, as established in Title 5, section 12004, subsection 10, in this chapter called the 31 "commission," shall consist of 10 <u>11</u> voting members and 5 ex officio, nonvoting members who shall be appointed and shall serve 33 as described in this section.

Sec. 2. 3 MRSA §901, sub-§1,  $\P\P$ A to C, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. EE, §1, are amended to read:

- A. The Director of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission, who shall be the permanent ehairman <u>chair</u> of the commission;
- B. Six members of the public, 4 of whom shall be appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate, and 2 by the Governor; and
- C. The Governor, Speaker of the House, President of the

- 49 Sec. 3. 3 MRSA §901, sub-§1, ¶D is enacted to read:
- 51 <u>D. The Director of the State Capitol Commission, who shall</u> <u>be appointed by the Legislative Council.</u>

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Sec. 4. 3 MRSA 901, sub-2, D, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. EE, 1, is amended to read:

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D. The Chairman Chair of the Capitol Planning Commission; and

Sec. 5. 3 MIRSA §901, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 816, 9 Pt. EE, §1, is amended to read:

11 З. Purpose. The commission shall approve any architectural, aesthetic and decorative alterations to the State Capitol Building and shall develop plans to preserve and develop 13 the aesthetic and historical integrity of the State Capitol 15 Building and adjacent grounds specified in section 902, subsection 2.

Sec. 6. 3 MRSA §902, sub-§§1 and 2, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 19 816, Pt. EE, §1, are amended to read:

21 1. Plan. The commission, with the assistance of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council, shall develop a 23 plan for the preservation and development of the aesthetic and historical integrity of the State Capitol Building and adjacent grounds specified in subsection 2. During the first week in 25 January, 1989, the commission shall submit an interim report 27 indicating its progress on the plan to the Legislative Council Upon receipt of the commission's completed plan, and Governor. the Legislative Council may submit the plan to the Legislature 29 for adoption and enactment as the official state plan for the 31 preservation and development of the aesthetic and historical integrity of the State Capitol Building. From time to time the 33 commission may submit additional amendments for inclusion in the plan which may be submitted to the Legislative Council for 35 adoption and enactment by the Legislature.

37 2. Jurisdiction. With respect to section 901, subsection the commission shall have jurisdiction over the entire З, exterior and interior of the State Capitol Building and its 39 immediate adjacent grounds, including Capitol Park, the area bounded on the east by the Kennebec River, on the north by 41 Capitol Street, on the south by Union Street and on the west by State Street, except that the private office of the Governor, at 43 the Governor's discretion, shall be exempt from this chapter. To ensure that the portion of Capitol Park that is controlled by the 45 City of Augusta can remain integrated with the portion of Capitol 47 Park that is controlled by the State, the commission may, in consultation with the City of Augusta, plan for the preservation 49 and development of a unified park area.

Sec. 7. 5 MRSA §299, first  $\P$ , as amended by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. EE, §4, is further amended to read:

The commission shall establish and maintain a master plan for the orderly development of future state buildings and grounds in the Capitol Area of the City of Augusta, with the exception of the State Capitol Building and its-immediate the adjacent grounds <u>specified in Title 3, section 902, subsection 2</u>. In maintaining the master plan, the commission shall take the following factors into consideration:

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill increases the membership of the State Capitol Commission to include the person appointed by the Legislative Council to the position of Director of the State Capitol Commission. The bill also specifies that portion of Capitol Park which falls within the jurisdiction of the commission and provides that, with respect to that portion of the park that is controlled by the City of Augusta, the commission may, in consultation with the city, plan for the preservation and development of a unified park area.

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
