An Act to Establish the Medicaid Advisory Committee on Mental Health.



### 1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

#### Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-I, sub-§42-A is enacted to read:

#### Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §§3189 and 3190 are enacted to read:

#### §3189. Medicaid Advisory Committee on Mental Health

1. Establishment. There is established as authorized in 13 Title 5, section 12004-I, the Medicaid Advisory Committee on Mental Health, referred to in this chapter as the "advisory 15 committee," in order to promote the availability and 17 accessibility of mental health services to Medicaid eligible people by monitoring the operations and provisions established by 19 the Bureau of Medical Services, by assessing the characteristics of programs provided in other states and federal provisions and 21 by advising the Bureau of Medical Services on appropriate policies and actions.

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2. Membership. The advisory committee shall consist of 7 members including: the Director of the Bureau of Children with Special Needs or the director's designee; the Director of the Bureau of Mental Health or the director's designee; one representative of mental health consumers appointed in consultation with a coalition of psychiatrically labeled people; one representative of families affected by mental illness to be appointed in consultation with an alliance for the mentally ill; one representative of providers of mental health services to be appointed in consultation with a state council of community mental health services; and 2 Legislators, one Senator and one member from the House of Representatives. All members shall be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House. The initial appointments to this advisory committee shall be made within 30 days of the effective date of this section. The members of the advisory committee shall select a chair from among their membership.

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3. Terms of membership; vacancies. The terms of office of appointed members shall be 2 years. Upon expiration of a member's term, the member shall serve until reappointed or until a successor is appointed. Any member may be removed for cause, which shall include excessive absences from meetings of the advisory committee. A vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner in which the initial appointment is made.

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4. Meetings. The advisory committee shall meet as necessary and may be convened at the call of the chair or any 2 members, with the initial meeting to be called by the chair of

people in this State. Currently Medicaid reimburses an array of services for children and youth, families and adults through several sections of state rules.

Currently there is no formal method for review and revision of policy or program provisions which incorporates the policy or program directions of the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation or comprehensive coordination of assessment, service planning or treatment protocols. Determination of costs and establishment of rates of reimbursement for services also occur without formal linkage to the extensive cost-reporting and audit data compiled by service agencies and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation. This bill establishes the Medicaid Advisory Committee on Mental Health.

This bill requires annual adjustment of reimbursement rates to reduce the need for the General Fund to subsidize costs of services which are reimbursable. Currently, rates are based on 1984 costs, which results in a loss of over \$800,000 in potential federal revenue.
