**An Act to Provide a Notification Mechanism for the Expiration of  
Motor Vehicle Registration.**

---



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §106-B is enacted to read:

5 §106-B. Notification of expiration

7 The Secretary of State shall notify any holder of a motor  
9 vehicle registration, which is due to expire, of the date of that  
11 expiration. This notification shall be sent not less than 30  
13 days before the expiration date of the holder's registration. In  
15 addition to the fee for registration required under section 242,  
the Secretary of State may require payment at the time of  
registration of an additional fee sufficient to cover the cost of  
preparing, processing and mailing notification of expiration  
under this section.

17 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated  
19 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

37 STATEMENT OF FACT

39 This bill would require that the Secretary of State notify  
41 persons when their motor vehicle registrations will expire. The  
43 notice will be given 30 days prior to the expiration. The cost  
of this notification would be covered by a notification fee to be  
paid at the time of registration.
