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STATEMENT OF FACT

5 The purpose of this bill is to standardize the compensation practices for bureau directors and certain other high-level 7 management positions which are significantly equal in terms of responsibility and accountability. Currently, some directors and high-level management positions are compensated by placement in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 2, section 6. 11 Other positions, even though similar in function and purpose, are subject to the civil service compensation system administered by 13 the Bureau of Human Resources for classified service employees. This bill addresses this variance in compensation practices by 15 identifying affected classifications, grouping them by function and responsibility, and placing them in the appropriate section 17 of Title 2, section 6. 19 The bill also converts 6 positions from the classified service to unclassified major policy influencing positions 21 serving at the pleasure of the appointing authority.
