**An Act to Require Administrators of Boarding Care Facilities to
Obtain Continuing Education.**



1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

3 **22 MRSA §7914** is enacted to read:

5 **§7914. Continuing education requirements for administrators**

7 The department, in consultation with the Residential Care
9 Committee of the Maine Health Care Association and other
11 providers of boarding care, shall adopt rules pursuant to the
13 Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375,
15 subchapter II, requiring administrators of boarding care
facilities to obtain continuing education credits. The
reasonable costs of obtaining the credits shall be paid by the
department without regard to the facility's routine service cost
limitation or administrative allowance.

STATEMENT OF FACT

21 Boarding care facilities serve a large number of
23 state-assisted residents who are elderly, retarded or disabled
25 either mentally or physically. Services performed by the
facilities have become more complex and require more education
and skills.

27 This bill requires the Department of Human Services to
29 establish regulations for the continuing education of the
administrators of boarding homes.
