IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Allow Municipalities to Remove Nonvoter Names from Voting Lists.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21-A MRSA §161, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6. Removal; failure to vote in presidential election. The registrar may request permission of the governing body of the municipality to remove from the voting list the name of any person who did not vote in the previous presidential election. Upon a majority vote of the governing body of the municipality, the registrar may remove those names from the voting list. Notwithstanding section 162, the registrar shall provide notice of removal under this subsection by posting, at the municipal offices or other appropriate public place, the name of any person removed from the voting list in lieu of sending notice of removal to that person. The registrar may remove the name of any voter from the voting list only after such a name has been publicly posted for 30 days.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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Many municipalities are finding it cumbersome and expensive to maintain accurate lists of registered voters, particularly in areas of high growth and population turnover leaving open the possibility for large scale absentee ballot fraud.

This bill gives municipalities the option of allowing their registrars to remove from the voting list the name of any person who did not vote in the preceding general election. The registrar will be allowed to remove names only after approval from the governing body of the town. A list of names to be removed will be publicly posted for 30 days before removal may take place.

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
