IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Protect Fishing Resources in Certain Ponds.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7673-A is enacted to read:
5	<u>§7673-A. Catch and release ponds</u>
7	1. Designation by rule. The commissioner shall, pursuant to section 7035, subsection 1, promulgate a rule designating
9	certain ponds in the State as open to catch and release fishing only. In making these designations, the commissioner shall take
11	into consideration:
13	A. The accessibility of the pond to the public;
15 17	B. The ability of the pond to maintain its supply of fish without stocking;
19	<u>C. The historic prevalence of trout of at least trophy size</u> in the pond; and
21	D. The general quality of the fishing experience in the pond.
23 25	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7674, sub-§2 is enacted to read:
27	2. Taking fish from a catch and release pond. A person is guilty of taking fish from a catch and release pond if the person takes but does not immediately release any fish from, or
29 31	possesses any dead fish taken from, any pond designated by the commissioner as a catch and release pond, pursuant to section
33	<u>7673-A.</u>
35	STATEMENT OF FACT
37	This bill requires the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to designate certain ponds in the State as open to catch
39	and release fishing only. The ponds designated should be accessible to the public, able to maintain their fish supply
41	without stocking, contain a supply of large trout and capable of providing a quality fishing experience.
