4 directed to conduct a study to determine the costs of
5 establishing an advanced nursing degree program for nurse

STATEMENT OF FACT

13

14 The Commission to Study the Status of Nursing Professions in
15 Maine has determined that there is a shortage of nurse
16 practitioners in Maine, and that no training program for nurse
17 practitioners exists in Maine. The commission determined that
18 the greatest need occurred in northern Maine.

20 This bill requests the Board of Trustees of the University
21 of Maine System to report back to the Legislature the costs of
22 establishing such a program.
