IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Provide Housing for the Homeless.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. Interagency committee on homelessness; establishment. Interagency Committee on Homelessness is established to inventory 5 the availability of resources for the homeless, coordinate their efficient delivery and ensure full utilization of federal funds 7 for the homeless. The committee shall include the following persons or their representatives: the Commissioner of Human 9 Services, Commissioner of Labor, the Commissioner the Corrections, the Commissioner of Economic and Community 11 Development, the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural 13 Services, the Director of the Division of Community Services, the Director of the Maine State Housing Authority; representative of private nonprofit agencies providing shelter 15 services, one representative of community action agencies, one 17 representative of private nonprofit housing developers, representative of municipalities and one representative of 19 low-income people, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate. The Director of 21 the Maine State Housing Authority shall be responsible for coordinating the committee's activity and reporting to the 23 Legislature by January 1st of each year on the progress in addressing the problem of homelessness and on the level of 25 federal funds brought into the State. Committee members shall provide the coordinator with a complete list of all the programs 27 and resources available for the homeless and shall assist in preparation of the annual comprehensive homeless assistance 29 Committee members shall, to the fullest extent possible, apply for all federal funds available for the homeless and 31 coordinate the delivery of assistance to the homeless with other departments and agencies.
