9 Seat belts reduce by 1/2 the chance of serious injury in an accident. Motor vehicle crashes account for over 200 deaths per 11 year in Maine. Nationally, motor vehicle crashes result in more cases of paraplegia and quadraplegia than all other causes 13 combined and are major causes of epilepsy and brain damage.
