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Sec. 2. Student intervention assistance. Resolved: That the commissioner conduct a study of the best method of implementing a program to identify academically at-risk students and to assist school administrative units in providing assistance to identified students to ensure they acquire the necessary competencies prior to graduation. The study and recommendations made in the commissioner's report shall include the following:

 A method to utilize the results of the 8th Grade Maine
 Educational Assessment Examination to identify students needing intervention assistance;

2. Guidelines for use by school administrative units in 15 providing intervention assistance to identified students;

17 3. Identification of a test or method of assessing identified students to determine whether they have attained the
19 competencies required for graduation or whether additional intervention assistance is required;

4. The projected budget needs of the department to ensure 23 that intervention assistance is fully funded by the State; and

25 5. A schedule for implementation of an intervention assistance program beginning with initial use of 8th grade 27 testing to develop student intervention assistance plans and reaching the stage of applying graduation competencies testing or 29 assessment to students for whom intervention assistance has been provided when those students reach graduation age; and be it 31 further

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That the commissioner shall submit a report, including any necessary implementing legislation, to
 the 114th Legislature by December 1, 1989.

FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Educational and Cultural Services will be 41 able to absorb within existing resources the cost of undertaking the studies and the report required by this resolve. However, 43 additional General Fund appropriations will be required by the fund mandatory department to statewide testing and an intervention assistance program. The amount and timing of these 45 additional appropriations cannot be determined until the 47 department submits the schedules for implementation as part of its report which is due by December 1, 1989.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "" to H.P. 957, L.D. 1335

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment retains the provisions of the original resolve requiring the development of graduation competency 7 testing in English and mathematics. The amendment adds a requirement that the Department of Educational and Cultural **q** Services develop a method of identifying students at risk of not 11 graduating in the 8th grade and of providing intervention assistance to assist those students to develop the competencies required to graduate. The methodology developed shall be made 13 available for use by local school units and implementation shall be funded by the State. 15
