An Act to Provide for Public Input and Comment Prior to the Adoption of Fishery Restoration and Management Plans.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §7015-A is enacted to read:

#### §7015-A. Fishery restoration and management plans

Prior to the adoption of any proposed fishery restoration or management plans for any waters of the State designated Class C pursuant to Title 38, sections 467 and 468, the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall provide public notice of the proposal and the opportunity to request a public hearing on the proposal. Individual notice shall be given to any industry or municipality discharging into the affected waters. Any public hearing requested under this section shall be held in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II. No plan shall be implemented unless the commissioner determines that the benefits outweigh the costs imposed by the plan.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to assure public notice and input via the Maine Revised Statutes, Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, prior to the adoption of fishery restoration or management plans for Class C waters including those rivers receiving substantial industrial and municipal waste water discharges. Abrupt changes in species for which the river is managed can impose a serious hardship on these facilities which, at present, are allowed no input into fisheries management plans by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.
