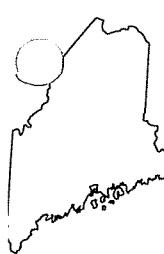

**An Act to Increase Eligibility Levels for the Low-Cost Drugs for the
Elderly Program.**



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 36 MRSA §6162-A, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 876, §§4
and 10, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

5
7 2. Income. Individuals representing single-member
households qualify for this program if their household income
does not exceed \$8,500 in 1989 and, as adjusted, in subsequent
9 years. Individuals representing households with 2 or more
members qualify for this program if their household income does
11 not exceed \$10,400 in 1989 and, as adjusted, in subsequent years.

STATEMENT OF FACT

17 This bill increases eligibility levels for the elderly
low-cost drug program to \$8,500 for single individuals and
19 \$10,400 for households with 2 or more members.
