An Act to Increase the Standard of Need for Aid to Families with Dependent Children.

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the maximum payment to Aid to Families with Dependent Children families in Maine is equal to only 1/2 of the poverty level; and

Whereas, eligible Aid to Families with Dependent Children families are only able to earn income which, in addition to program benefits, brings their income to just over 2/3 of the poverty level; and

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Whereas, many Aid to Families with Dependent Children families are unable to purchase even the basic necessities of food, clothing and shelter because of their inadequate income; and

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Whereas, this creates great hardship and anxiety for these families and significant cost to municipal general assistance programs which must assist them; and

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Whereas, the newly enacted federal Family Support Act now requires states to reevaluate their Aid to Families with Dependent Children need and payment standards; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. Commission created. The Commission to Evaluate the Adequacy of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children Need and Payment Standards is created.

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The commission shall consist of 13 members appointed in the following manner: 2 Senators, and 2 members of the House of Representatives one each from the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriation and Financial Affairs, to be appointed by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives respectively; one representative of the Department of Human Services; one representative the Maine Municipal οf Association, one member of the Aid to Families appointed by the Governor; with Dependent Children Advisory Council; one representative of licensed social workers; one representative of the academic disciplines of social work, sociology, labor economics or other relevant fields of study; one representative of private nonprofit agency providing services to Aid to Families with Dependent Children recipients; and 3 representatives of Aid to Families

1 with Dependent Children recipients to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives. All appointments shall be made within 30 days of the effective date of this section. The commission members 5 shall select a chair at their first meeting. 7 The commission shall study the adequacy of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children program's need and payment standards to meet the cost of basic necessities for eligible a families. Specifically, the commission shall: 11 Determine an amount that represents the actual cost to low-income families of purchasing basic necessities on a 13 monthly basis and specify the methodology by which that 15 determination has been made; 17 Examine the adequacy of the current Aid to Families with Dependent Children need and payment standards to enable eligible families to purchase these basic necessities; and 19 21 Recommend legislation which establishes a reasonable taking maximum advantage of federal participation, and a timetable for assuring that recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits receive 25 sufficient income on an annual basis to meet their expenses for basic necessities. 27 3. When the appointment of all commission members is completed, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the 29 first meeting by September 15, 1989. 31 The Department of Human Services shall assist with the 33 scheduling of meetings and provide the commission with staff and access to information as appropriate and necessary to carry out 35 its charge. 37 The commission shall submit a report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session 39 of the 114th Legislature by February 15, 1990. 41 Sec. 2.
