**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, there are numerous immediate and pressing concerns about the use of water resources in the Piscataqua River Basin and environs, including concerns arising from increased river traffic, identified hazardous waste sites, discharges of sewerage that impair shellfish beds and greatly increased development pressures within the basin; and

Whereas, these concerns arise from ongoing activities that degrade the quality of limited resources within the basin and therefore must be addressed immediately; and

Whereas, a study commission is proposed to address these 17 concerns and propose remedial actions and legislation to alleviate negative impact; and

Whereas, a study is most efficiently and economically conducted during the summer months and must be initiated quickly so that legislation may be proposed to the next session of the Legislature; and

25 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 27 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 29 safety; now, therefore, be it

Study commission created and charged. Resolved: That there is 31 established the Commission to Study the Feasibility of Establishing a Piscataqua River Basin Compact between Maine and 33 New Hampshire. The commission shall study the conditions 35 existing within the Piscataqua River Basin and the feasibility of establishing an interstate compact to create a Piscataqua River Basin Authority to be jointly created by the states of Maine and 37 given either regulatory advisory New Hampshire and or 39 responsibility for activities within the basin which have an interstate impact, such as recreational boating, pollution 41 control, fishing, shellfish harvesting, waterfront development, dredging, navigation and the preservation of wetlands and public access; and be it further 43

Appointment. Resolved: That the study commission shall 45 consist of 11 members. There shall be one Senator appointed by 47 the President of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker the House of of 49 Representatives; one person appointed by the Governor; the Director of the Maine Coastal Program; and one municipal official, one representative of the commercial fishing industry, 51 one representative of recreational boaters, one representative of

an environmental organization, one representative of a municipal port authority or a designee who may be a harbor master and one 0.401 representative of a conservation commission, all appointed jointly by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate shall promptly notify the Legislative Council of the appointments; and be it further 

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Convening of commission. Resolved: That, when the appointment of all commission members is completed, the chair of 11 the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting on or before August 1, 1989. At the first meeting, the members shall elect a 13 chair and other officers; and be it further

Interstate cooperation. Resolved: That the members of the 114th 17 Legislature of the State of Maine respectfully request the members of the legislature of the state of New Hampshire to 19 consider the establishment of a parallel study commission under the authority of that state and further direct the commission established by this resolve to cooperate fully with officials, 21 legislators and citizens of New Hampshire in the conduct of the 23 study and development of the findings of the commission and further direct the commission to solicit from the officials, legislators and residents of that state their views on the 25 desirability of an interstate authority having either regulatory 27 jurisdiction or advisory powers; and be it further

29 **Report.** Resolved: That the commission shall complete its study by November 1, 1989, and present its findings, together 31 with any recommended legislation to the 114th Legislature by December 1, 1989; and be it further

Assistance. Resolved: That, if staff assistance is desired, 35 assistance shall be requested from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators shall receive the legislative per diem, as 39 defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at meetings and all members shall receive 41 reimbursement expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further 43

Appropriation. Resolved: 45 That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of 47 this resolve.

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This resolve establishes a study commission to determine the 33 feasibility of establishing a Piscataqua River Basin compact. The purpose of the study is to determine whether some type of bas tilo 35 interstate authority between Maine and New Hampshire is necessary or desirable for the proper maintenance of the Piscataqua River 37 Basin and whether such an authority should have regulatory or advisory powers. It is the intent of the Legislature that this 39 commission fully cooperate with and, to the maximum extent feasible, involve officials, legislators and residents of the 41 state of New Hampshire in reaching its determinations and making solution of New Hampshire in reaching its determinations and making its findings. 12 

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
