21	An increasing number of those ice fishing on Maine waters are adding antifreeze, typically containing ethylene glycol, to holes cut in the ice to prevent ice formation. The number of
23	those ice fishing is increasing. This bill makes this practice a civil violation carrying a fine of from \$50 to \$200. The purpose
25	of the bill is to prevent environmental degradation from the addition of these toxic substances to the waters of this State.
