STATEMENT OF FACT

The federal Department of Housing and Urban Development has provided capital and operational funds to establish transitional living programs at 3 locations in the State: Lewiston, Rumford and Hinckley. These programs will be operated by New Beginnings, Inc., Rumford Group Home and Goodwill-Hinckley. These nonprofit organizations will involve appropriate youth in group home living, progressing to semi-independent and eventually totally independent living arrangements. The group home semi-independent portions of these 3 programs will offer services to up to 38 individuals at any one time. Appropriate counselors will be hired by the agencies to counsel, train and educate the youth to be served.

The federal Department of Housing and Urban Development requires the facilities operating transitional housing programs to obtain matching state or local funds on a dollar-for-dollar basis. Currently, there are inadequate state or local funds specifically allocated for this purpose. This bill provides
