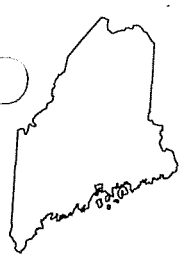

**An Act to Establish a Fund to Provide Education for Emergency
Medical Service Personnel Statewide and to Provide Matching Funds
for Equipment for Emergency Medical Services.**



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §2303-A is enacted to read:

5 §2303-A. Mandatory addition to penalty

7 1. Fee imposed. In addition to the penalties provided in
9 section 2303 or other penalties provided in this Title, a \$25 fee
11 shall be imposed on any person convicted of a moving violation
13 under this Title that results in an accident.

15 2. Funds dedicated. Funds generated by the fee provided in
17 subsection 1 shall be dedicated to the Emergency Medical Services
19 Fund established in Title 32, section 88-A.

21 Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §88-A is enacted to read:

23 §88-A. Emergency Medical Services Fund

25 1. Fund established. The Emergency Medical Services Fund
27 is established and shall be administered by the board.

29 2. Funding. Funds shall be provided by fees imposed
31 pursuant to Title 29, section 2303-A.

33 3. Disbursement. Funds distributed by this section shall
35 be apportioned as follows.

37 A. Fifty percent of annual revenue shall be used to provide
39 matching funds to licensed emergency medical services
41 providers for equipment and other capital expenditures.

43 B. Fifty percent of annual revenue shall be used to provide
45 training for emergency medical persons.

47 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

This bill establishes the Emergency Medical Services Fund to support emergency medical services operations, provide matching funds to licensed service providers and promote training of emergency medical persons.

Revenue for the fund shall be generated by a \$25 fee imposed on all persons convicted of a moving violation involving the operation of a motor vehicle that results in an accident.
