NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the State Identification Law for Developmentally Disabled Students.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §88-A, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1987, c. 342,
5 §1, is further amended to read:

7 1. Application. Any Except as provided in subsection 1-A,
9 any person 21 years of age or over may apply for an official
11 state nondriver identification card. The application must shall
13 be on a form provided by the Secretary of State and include any
15 supporting documents and information required by the Secretary of
17 State.

19 A. The application form must include, directly above the
21 signature line, the following notice to the applicant: "I
23 understand that knowingly supplying false information on
25 this form is a Class D crime under Title 17-A, punishable by
27 confinement of up to 364 days or by monetary fine of up to
29 \$1,000, or both."

31 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §88-A, sub-§1-A is enacted to read:

33 1-A. Application by developmentally disabled students. Any
35 student with developmental disabilities, 16 years of age or
37 older, who is enrolled in a school-supported work program may
39 apply for an official state nondriver identification card. The
41 application shall be on a form provided by the Secretary of State
43 and shall provide proof of that student's enrollment in a work
45 program.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

33 Currently, students with developmental disabilities who are
35 enrolled in school-supported work programs must purchase
37 identification cards costing \$10 each. This bill provides that
39 students may apply for and receive official state nondriver
41 identification cards, costing \$2 each.
