SENATE AMENDMENT " C " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1025, L.D. 1431, Bill, "An Act to Promote Reduction, Recycling and Integrated Management of Solid Waste and Sound Environmental Regulation"

Amend the amendment in that part designated "Part E" by striking out all of section 35 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 35. 38 MRSA §1604 is enacted to read:


§1604. Plastic bags

After January 1, 1990, all retailers in Maine shall use paper bags to bag products at the point of retail sale unless the consumer requests a plastic bag.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment removes from the committee amendment that section prohibiting the sale of products in containers that are connected to each other by plastic holding devices.
