An Act to Simplify the Process by Which People with Disabilities Are Able to Acquire Information and Apply for Services.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

#### PL 1987, c. 845, §4, first sentence, is amended to read:

Rehabilitation, The Bureau of in establishing and 17 administering a program of personal care assistance services for severely disabled adults, shall expand its present program to 19 serve an additional 20 new consumers and shall provide through contract with providers of in-home personal care assistance for an-average compensation a reimbursement rate of \$7 an hour for 21 personal care assistants services, payment of \$12 each night for 23 each client to for overnight attendants and the establishment of a pro rata group benefits package that, not-to-exceed for the 25 purposes of calculation rather than entitlement, shall be based on at least \$1,000 for each personal-care-attendant consumer, 27 including health insurance, vacation and sick leave for personal care assistants.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the Department of Educational and Cultural Services to include in its annual budget any funds necessary to maintain an independent, community-based central information system on resources for people with disabilities. After initial start-up costs, the system may become financially self-supporting.

 In addition, the bill directs the Department of Educational and Cultural Services to study the feasibility of creating a
 single entry point application process to enable any disabled person to apply for any available services from one location in
 that person's community.

47 The bill also establishes the Commission to Study Funding of Personal Care Assistant Services to develop a formula to
49 determine future assistant services funding needs. Finally, the bill amends the current benefits system formula for personal care
51 attendants.
