Resolve, to Study and Consolidate the Laws and Rules Regulating
Campgrounds.



1 **Sec. 1. Study of campground regulation. Resolved:** That the
2 Commissioner of Conservation shall undertake a study of all the
3 laws and rules regulating campgrounds, with the goal of creating
4 a bureau or division, within the Department of Conservation,
5 which consolidates campground regulation. The commissioner shall
6 develop proposed legislation to:
7

8 1. Establish this bureau or division as the sole agency of
9 the State responsible for all regulation of campgrounds; and

10 2. Ensure that the regulation adequately differentiates
11 between those campgrounds which are open and used year round and
12 those which are purely seasonal or targeted to the tourist
13 industry; and be it further

14 **Sec. 2. Report. Resolved:** That the commissioner shall submit
15 a report on this study, including any necessary implementing
16 legislation, to the 114th Legislature by December 1, 1989.

20 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

21 This resolve requires the Commissioner of Conservation to
22 study campground regulation. The goals of this study are to
23 consolidate all campground regulation within one bureau and to
24 adequately differentiate between year-round and seasonal
25 campgrounds in this regulation.
