STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study Alternative Education.

- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Alternative Education is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission shall consist of the following 10 members:
- 1. Three Legislators serving on the Joint Standing Committee on Education to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 2. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services or the commissioner's designee; and
- 3. One member from each of the following groups, to be 15 appointed by the Governor:
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- A. The Maine Elementary Principals Association;
- 19 B. The Maine Secondary School Principals' Association;
- 21 C. The Maine School Management Association;
- 23 D. The Maine Teachers Association;
- 25 E. The Maine School Boards Association; and
- 27 F. The Maine Home School Association; and be it further
- 29 Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** That all appointments shall be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. 31 The Executive Director of the notified Legislative Council shall be by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. The Chair of the 33 Council Legislative shall call thefirst meeting of the The commission shall select a chair 35 commission. its from membership; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake a study of alternatives to attendance at public day schools with a primary goal of ensuring that any such alternative in the State will be an equivalent instruction alternative. As part of the study, the commission shall:
- Investigate and evaluate methods of measuring student
 achievement and determining teacher proficiency;
- 47 2. Establish minimum instructor requirements and testing mechanisms to ensure that those requirements are met;
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Develop a supervision system which would require an 3. appropriate authority to supervise an alternative instructor and to prepare written evaluation reports;

Determine at which level, whether, local school boards 4. or the Department of Educational and Cultural Services, overall supervision and implementation of alternative instruction programs should occur;

Determine whether, to what degree and under what 5. circumstances certain public school facilities and programs 11 should be made available to students in alternative instruction 13 programs;

15 6. Evaluate the current education funding formula in relation to alternative instruction, taking into account any determinations made under subsections 5 and 9; 17

19 7. Study the issue of teacher certification requirements for alternative instructors and whether a differentiation should 21 be made based upon the grade level being taught;

Define "home schooling" and prepare proposed legislation 8. to regulate home schooling statutorily; and

Assess issues of liability and develop a method to 9. assign liability for education and personal injury; and be it further

Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 31 its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature by January 33 31, 1990; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: 35 That the commission shall request from the Legislative Council sufficient staff assistance to carry out these duties; and be it further 37

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: 39 That the members of the commission who are Legislators shall receive the legislative per 41 diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. All members of 43 the commission who are not state employees shall receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, 45 section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further

Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are 49 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
