#### STATE OF MAINE

Resolve, to Establish the School Organization Study Committee .



Sec. 1. Committee established; duties. Resolved: That there is School Organization established the Study Committee. committee shall study the various organizational laws of special school administrative units authorized by statute. shall encompass a comprehensive review of school administrative districts, community school districts, school unions and union schools. Included in the study shall be a determination of the impact of these various school organizational structures on the workload of school administrators and the time and the number of personnel needed to effectively manage the various organizational units. The committee shall make recommendations concerning any changes to the special school administrative organizational laws; and be it further

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- Sec. 2. Committee membership. Resolved: That the committee shall be comprised of the following 9 members: the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services or the commissioner's designee; 3 Legislators serving on the Joint Standing Committee on Education to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and one school business manager, one local school board member, one municipal manager, one municipal finance director and one selectman, all to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further
- Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: all appointments shall be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall notified be by all authorities once the selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting committee. The committee shall select a chair from its membership; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 114th Legislature by December 15, 1989; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the committee who are legislators shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at committee meetings. All members of the committee who are not state employees shall receive expenses, as defined in Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further
- Sec. 6. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
